Have you ever wondered what the differences are between a toy RC car that can usually be bought for well under \$100.00 and a real RC car? We did too. So we bought a toy RC car for \$70.00 from the local toy store and we did a comparison.

The car we compared was one of our least expensive models, the Carisma 1/14 Nissan GT-R R35 (part number RTRCRSM14GTRR35) which retails for a little over A\$100.00.

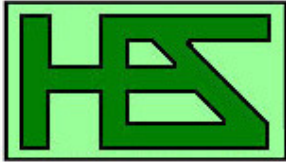

Hand controller batteries	AA batteries not included	AA batteries included
Car batteries	AA batteries not included	Rechargeable AA batteries included with charger
Speed control	Simple forward / reverse with no ability to vary speed.	Fully adjustable speed control. You can slow down and speed up.
Steering	Simple full left or full right steering.	Fully variable steering. Turn a little or a lot.
Speed	Single speed fairly slow.	Top speed about three times that of the toy car.
Hand Control Trim	No trim. When the wheels become out of alignment you just try to compensate with the hand controller which isn't easy.	Full trim adjustment.

	Toy Car	Carisma RC Car
Tyres	Hard plastic	Quality rubber. Can be replaced.
Body	Brittle plastic. Easy to break. Can not easily be removed from car and no replacement available.	Quality pliable plastic which can take a reasonable knock without breaking. Held on by body clips and can easily be replaced. Spares available.
Suspension	None.	Hobby shock absorbers. Fully replaceable.
Spare Parts	None available.	Full parts list available so you can replace damaged parts.

So it's clear that you get what you pay for. The added functions are worth much more than the difference in price, and the availability of spare parts will prolongue the life of the car and save you having to buy a whole new car when you have a crash.

Add to this the more durable body and better control, and the likelihood of a car destroying crash with the real RC car is much less than with the toy car.
